Mr. NTSA Senadeera served university of Peradeniya for 37 years, since 1965. As the 5th Librarian of the University of Peradeniya, Mr. NTSA Senadeera completed service of 20 years and 9 months when he retired at the end of September 2002. Mr. NTSA Senadeera, is an eminent scholar, who contributed immensely in developing the University of Peradeniya Library as a most comprehensive University Library in Sri Lanka during his term of office.

University of Peradeniya Library : Leading Light of the Excellence

The University of Peradeniya is proud to possess its greatest treasure, the Library which is now one hundred years old. When describing the University of Peradeniya Library (UoPL), it is popularly said that “ the Library is older than the University”. This feature article deals with the brief account of UoPL, the leading light of the excellence of University of Peradeniya.



Brief History

UoPL originated in the “College House”, Thurstan Road , Colombo as the Library of the Ceylon University College established in January 1921. It became the University of Ceylon Library with the establishment of the first University of Sri Lanka in 1942. When the University was shifted to its permanent home from Colombo to the spacious University Park at Peradeniya the Library was also moved to the Arts Faculty building of new campus. in October 1952 with the collection of 30,000 materials housed at Villa Vanetia and the first professionally qualified Librarian in Sri Lanka, Mr. R.L.Enright. In 1960, the seven story Library building was constructed on the banks of the Mahaweli River. Construction initiated during the colonial period. it is mainly a brick and mortar building which is a mix of colonial and local architectural characteristics. A forced draft ventilation system including a dust filtering mechanism installed in the library basement convey filtered air to the upper floors during the warmer months of the year. Seven floors of the library are built for specific use and fixed functions. Six storied identical, new-wing to the library was added in August 2020 to extend and expand its services to patrons.

Nature of the location of different faculties in the university had made it necessary for establishing a faculty-oriented library system. Accordingly, seven libraries were established gradually, provided with expanded services in each faculty forming a Library System. Main library basically caters to the faculty of arts and also function as a Central Library for the entire user universe of the university. This multi sited library caters around 10,000 members of the university community today, holds over 800,000 items of rare, valuable and significant work acquired by the University and bestowed by donors.

Collection

Traditionally Libraries, Archives and Museums (LAMs) are developed and expected to handle different collections in various formats and media, employing different professional practices (Rayward, 1998; Tanackoviae and Badurina, 2008). Although development of LAM systems from a shared history (Bierbaum, 1994) libraries generally preserve printed materials, while museums possess two dimensional and three dimensional objects (Tonta, 2008). The early benefactors in their desire to promote growth of UoPL into a great seat of learning had acquired many valuable collections in the form of textual and non-textual materials. Hence, notwithstanding the accepted norms, UoPL holds different formats of materials. The Aesthetic, historic and educational value of these collections are enhanced by the great number of rare books, manuscripts, paintings, Copper plate charters, maps, Gramophone records, hand drawings, water colour drawings, microfilms and publications on Sri Lanka etc. Palm Leaf Manuscript Collection acquired in 1960s from Late Dr. N.B.P.Goonetilleke, on the recommendation of Professor Senarath Paranavithana and Government Archivist is considered the second largest collection in Sri Lanka. UoPL is eventually developed as a legal depository, an archive of national repository of information through its massive collection and a museum that holds different forms of Cultural Heritage Resources (CHRs).

Access

Users increasing expectation of accessing information in a single search, across the domains is the ever facing challenge of a Library. Bringing together the collections of various formats available, under the umbrella of term 'document' UoPL provides with a nearly a complete solution for information distribution and exchange in seamless way following the thingness of the information that surpasses the distinctions of the nature of collections such as data, documents, objects, manuscripts, artefacts, specimen, record group or file (Buckland, 1997). This provides a fertile ground for creating cohesiveness among collections through digital access.

Library card catalogue was the main key to the library's collections until year 2000 since the inception of library. The library which was among the pioneers in application of Information Technology in the field of Library and Information Science launched its automation project in 2002 using off the shelf Library Management Software (LMS) Package ; Alice for Windows and later on was shifted to Koha open source LMS. Library's Institutional Repository which demonstrates the intellectual output of the University research community is accessible on www.lib.pdn.ac.lk. Stimulated by growing user demands and expectations access to e-resources is provided through Library website. Faced with fast developing information and communication technology, scholarly needs and issues dealing with handling and maintaining of resources urged facilitating a centrally located complex for all kind of information. Hence spaces in the new wing of the Library are dedicated to differently able undergraduates, British Council Digital Wall, Zoom conference hall, etc.

100 years of impact and excellence

Now 100 years later, when we retrospect the history of the development of UoPL, perseverance, dedication and loyalty portrayed by its key figures are remarkable. The story of UoPL was built upon a strong vision of its key benefactors which made the Library where today. UoPL developed fast with the growth of the university, has contributed immensely in making undergraduates successful achievers and resourceful contributors for the future. An increased focus on research driven agendas has heightened interest in the services and resources provided by the library. Altruistic services, unrelenting labour and intellectual breadth of University of Peradeniya Librarians, its staff and patrons played a major role, when this Green and pleasant seat of learning, became a center of excellence and the most prominent higher education institute of Sri Lanka .

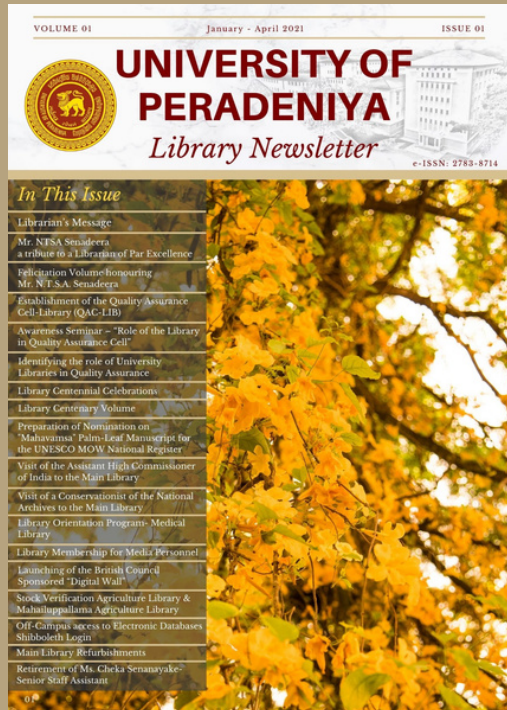
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Workshop on Preparation of Detail Course Content and Teaching Plan for Library Academic Staff

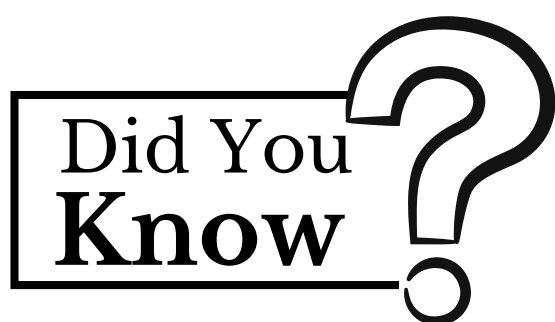

Re-imaging Academic Library Services: during COVID 19 pandemic situation

Introduction

Institutions of higher education in all over the world are undergoing unprecedented change due to the sudden outbreak of COVID 19 pandemic. Universities around the world have been forced to shift online teaching and learning since March 2020. It has negatively impacted on university students life and their future plans. University closures, unplanned rapid shifts to online learning, introduction of non pharmaceutical interventions, and closure of university facilities have had ramifications for the educational experiences of university students and their mental, physical wellbeing.

Under these circumstances, there is an enormous challenge faced by university libraries to support the university community and maintain its academic research activity through remote and virtual teaching and learning. This article describes the services provided by academic libraries, challenges faced when providing services to academic community and lessons learned during this pandemic situation.

COVID 19 – Impact on Libraries

Academic libraries were directly impacted by the Covid-19 virus not only in terms of physical space but also in the collections and services they provide to their community (Medawar 2020). Such as,

- Due to COVID 19 pandemic situation, libraries had to deal with the closures and interruptions to regular services and activities. As reduction and suspension of access to libraries which paralyzed the borrowing activities and all related services offered inside the Library.
- Libraries had to implement new systems in place to continue undisrupted and reliable services.

- In some countries going along with government policies, Library visits should be pre confirmed by booking system.
- Diminishing value of print collections : In this pandemic situation circulating print collections have become immaterial, therefore libraries had to search for alternatives to make content readily available.
- E – Everything : Since March 2020, libraries are experiencing the use of electronic resources, increased tremendously compared to previous years. Internet and the electronic resources became main portals of the information gathering by students, teaching staff and research.

COVID 19- Transform the Role of Libraries

Due to unannounced and indefinite shut downs, Librarians had to change their strategies to support the users' activities during the pandemic. This created major challenges and opportunities such as,

- **Support for online teaching and research**
After sudden shutdown of the universities, libraries are working hard to support online teaching, learning and research of the university community. Most of the library resources are available and accessible through library websites. Library websites are main access point to the library users. Further, libraries organized the off campus access to library electronic resources (shibolth access to subscribed e journals, databases) and Thesis, past papers. In addition to that, Libraries increased their virtual communication methods. Library users can consult, contact list of information specialists

who are working online and they communicate through chat, email queries. In the meantime, librarians are negotiating with publishers and content providers to acquire free access to e books which users can refer in this challenging period.

- **Increase of Digital content services** Libraries extended its digital content with library guides, free e – copy service, book chapters, articles, and inter library loan service.
- **Recalibrate reference desk** This crisis created physical counter desk into online mode. Librarians and the staff continuously help students and researchers requests and provide services through online method.
- **The rise of Open Educational Resources (OER)** As libraries remain closed through this pandemic, librarians had to develop alternative pathways for research dissemination through institutional repositories and support open access publishing. Librarians are working with members of faculties in educating about the benefits of creating and adopting open educational resources, free or low cost text books (Cox, 2020)

COVID 19- Challenges

- **Lack of digital infrastructure** Digital advances have opened up new avenues for librarians to create new roles and new ways of delivering library services (Huwiler, 2016) However, some libraries may not have the equipment to accomplish digitization. At the same time, organizational & cultural barriers aggravate this problem (Tammaro, 2020). The corona virus pandemic has uncovered these problems and accelerated the digital transition of educational institutions & libraries
- **Copyright issues** As university courses are conducted online, students' require greater access to materials for their courses. However, copyright laws has always been unreasonably restrictive. Librarians must educate faculty members on copyright issues as well as fair use of copyrighted materials for educational purposes. Further, encourage authors to use creative commons licenses for publishing their research (Cox, 2020).

- **Budget cuts** Decreasing institutional budgets is a great challenge for subscribing and purchasing library materials. Unlike print materials, usage of electronic resources has become popular among academic community. Therefore, over the next few years libraries have to spend more money for subscribe and develop electronic collections. Librarians have to come up with new strategies to negotiate preferable deals with publishers. Also they should campaign for greater access to streaming media and e-books to individuals cheaply since individuals cannot afford to pay hefty sums like libraries. In the meantime, librarians have to deal with the publishers and suppliers to extend their terms of agreements (Wijetunge 2021).

COVID 19 – Lessons Learned

The pandemic situation has changed and expanded services of the academic libraries in to new paradigm. This lesson revealed that online services of the libraries are priority sources of the information in the context of non–contact education (Zhou,2021). It has unveiled the need for digital transformation strategies and programs for libraries. Based on this experience, libraries are recommended to adopt emergency plans to be able to carry out library services in safety management, digital optimization of library services in unexpected situation (Zhou,2021). If the pandemic situation continues in future, academic libraries should draw their attention to 'open science agenda policy'. This will promote researcher and institutional internet visibility as well as research impact. Further, librarians should make an effort to encourage academics and researchers to publish their research in open access policies and produce OERs. OER suddenly became vital source of supplementary academic resource in this pandemic era.

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Resource Centre for Special Needs Students

University of Peradeniya as the Main Grantee of a Capacity Building project funded by Erasmus Mundus; Developing Inclusive Education for Students with disabilities in Sri Lankan Universities (IncEdu Project) is planning to develop a resource center for disable students. The Library will facilitate the special needs students with the aid of the project. The project has received 60.00 Mn LKR (Approximately) and several equipment ; computers (35), Laptop + UPS (05), Photocopier (01), Duxbury Software for brail Translation (02) have already been purchased and another more to come. The project coordinator is Senior Professor ASP Abayarathne , Department of Economics and Statistics, Faculty of Arts.

Ongoing Projects



BAR-CODING OF REFERENCE COLLECTION IN THE MAIN LIBRARY

Main Library of the University of Peradeniya has started to barcode Reference Collection from 20th August 2021 by using the KOHA Library Management Software. This collection is located at the Reading Room I , Ground Floor of the Main Library



DUMBARA LENDING COLLECTION

The Lending collection of the Main Library is comprised of 'Dumbara Books' where the books housed at the Dumbara sub-campus were also shifted to the University of Peradeniya premises. Before merging these books to the main library collection, the re-classification has been conducted according to the Main Library Classification Scheme.

This collection was started to barcode in 2017 with the KOHA software and presently, the barcoding project of the lending collections in the main library is completed. The books brought from the Dumbara campus also amalgamated with the Main Library Collection.



COMPLETING GAPS OF ACCESSION REGISTERS

"The Library has started a special project to complete the gaps of the Accession Register which is the most requisite for the library. The project mainly focuses on finding the incomplete segments of the existing accession register and completing the Accession Register of the UoP Library system".

PROJECT ON STREAMLINING THE RECORDS OF THE READING ROOM 2 OF THE MAIN LIBRARY

The Reading Room 2 of the Main Library of University of Peradeniya considered the largest of its nature in a University library of Sri Lanka. It consists of more than 21,000 of reference materials related to different subject disciplines taught at the eight faculties of University of Peradeniya. By the way, the largest portion of the collection is acquired by the faculty of Arts as the Main Library basically caters for the faculty of Arts. Recently the Reader Services Division of the Main Library has been initiated a project to streamlining the records available in the Reading Room 2. Accordingly, all the materials logged in the collection will be crosschecked with the KOHA Library system. If missing items found, steps will be taken to enter those in the library management system. Apart from this, the project is aiming at finding the materials to be obsolete, discarded and withdrawn. The project is monitored and supervised with the support of Reader Services staff by Mr. A. Dharmarathne, Senior Assistant Librarian of the Reader Services of the Main Library.
